Dear Parents & Friends,

### **Covid-19**

Although restrictions are meant to ease over the coming weeks, rates of infection are rising rapidly, particularly in the northwest, and the general view in education is that we should see out the remainder of this term with caution. Some changes have been made to our operation: the children in school are already mixing more at lunchtimes and in assemblies; music and swimming lessons have re-commenced and children are taking part in more trips, extra-curricular activities and inter-school sporting competitions.

We will, however, continue the staggered start and end of the day, and parents are respectfully asked to maintain 2m social distancing and not congregate outside of school. If you wish to speak to a member of staff, please telephone or email and make an appointment.

Finally, we had hoped to invite you to attend a Sports Day (7th July) and Leavers' Service (15th July) this year. However, the current advice is that parents should not be invited en-masse to attend a school event.
